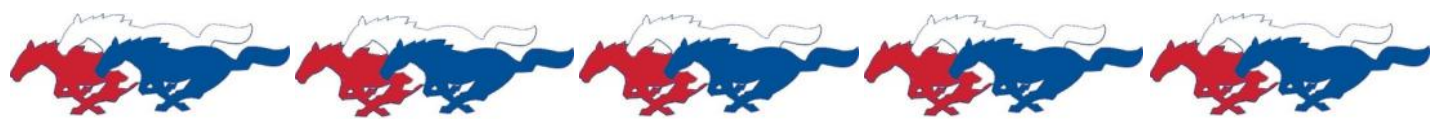

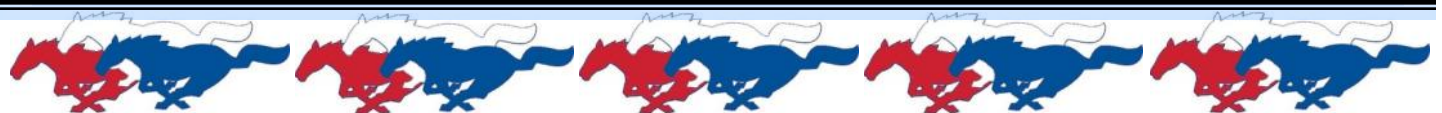

2022 Fairfield Veterans Day Parade

On Friday November 11, the City of Fairfield, through the Parks and Recreation Department, held its annual Veterans Day Parade. One great thing about living in close proximity to Travis Air Force Base is the way Fairfield and the surrounding cities in Solano County show respect, support and admiration to our entire military community and especially our Veterans. This annual parade is just one way that this is accomplished. While Fairfield is known for its 10am ceremony and lunch-time parade, Vacaville, Dixon and Suisun also hold Veterans Day events and ceremonies. This year's parade theme was "SERVING WITH HONOR"

I feel the parade themes over these last several years have been very meaningful and appropriate. Prior parade themes have been: 2021 - "FRONT LINE PATRIOTS"; 2019 - "CELEBRATING 100 YEARS OF AMERICAN LEGION"; 2018 - "CELEBRATING TRAVIS AIR FORCE BASE 75TH ANNIVERSARY"; 2017 - "WITH RESPECT, HONOR and GRATITUDE"; 2016 - "PRAY. THANK. REMEMBER" and from 2015: "LAND OF THE FREE, BECAUSE OF THE BRAVE". I particularly like this last one. But they are all good stuff to pause and reflect on...

While I personally never served in the armed forces, my late dad was a transport pilot for the Air Force for 21 years, flying the C-124 (Ol' Shakey!) for ten years, the C-141 for six years, and finally the C-5 for his last three years. He also spent six months flying the F-100 Super Sabre at Clovis AFB New Mexico, in preparation for his tour in Vietnam in 1967-68, and then retired from Travis as a Lt. Col. when I was just a little guy. And now my son, after graduating from Embry Riddle Aeronautical University in May 2019, is an Air Force pilot flying the B-52 at Barksdale AFB in Louisiana, following in his grandfather's footsteps. So the personal connection to the Air Force is strong, and I'm pleased that our club, through the efforts of Bill Davis and many others, does so much for our Veterans.

We started the day at our usual Solano Mall/Starbucks parking lot meeting place at the requested arrival time of 10:15am and had plenty of time to visit with each other. As always, it was good to see a pretty even mix between the old 1960's-70's classics and the modern ponies. And what would a Veterans Day Parade be without seeing Terry Burke looking sharp in his Air Force dress blues?

Soon it was time to head over to our assigned staging area on Kentucky Street, and the past apprehension I used to feel leading a caravan of Mustangs to the staging spot (where would we encounter the hassle of an unplanned barricade this year?) has been alleviated by the Parks & Rec Dept. keeping the check-in process consistent with prior parades.

Once again, and for as many years as I can remember, The Golden Hills Mustang Club made a strong presence at this parade, this year with 16 Mustangs! Although 16 is a little short of the 20 plus cars we've had at some recent parades, we still had a lot more cars than other car clubs (ahem, and

better looking too!). The Judging Committee felt this way also, awarding our club first place in the vehicle club category with a nice \$150 award.

Also once again, the parade organizer asked me to provide my '68 convertible to carry the Grand Marshal in the parade; this year it was Daniel Blake, who retired at Travis after a long career of service to his country. Mr. Blake was very pleased, and humbled, with this honor.

With our cars decorated in our usual patriotic theme, we were waiting for the low altitude flyover of an Air Force C-5 which signals for the parade to begin. This year, word spread through the crowd that the flyover was cancelled at the last minute. As I passed the news around to fellow parade participants, I took the opportunity to embellish/enhance the news with interesting details like... "the pilots left the keys at home!" or ... "ignition key was left on overnight and drained the battery, couldn't find another plane to jump start it!" and "...rookie pilot over pumped the gas pedals and flooded the Holley carburetors!"

Soon it was time to take our turn parading down Texas Street. Just like last year, when we reached the judging stand, the parade emcee encouraged us to "rev 'em up a little...let's hear those ponies roar!"

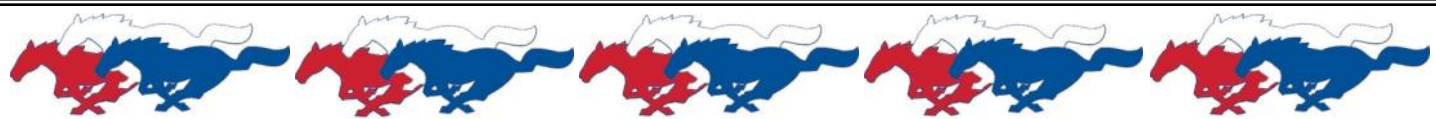

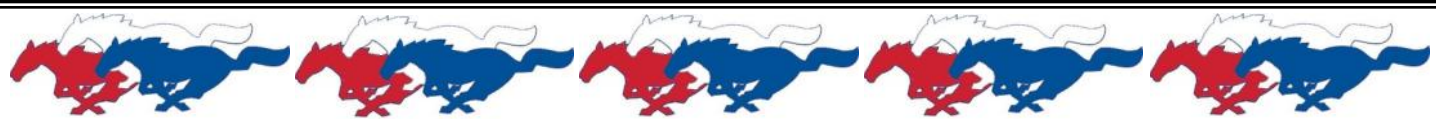

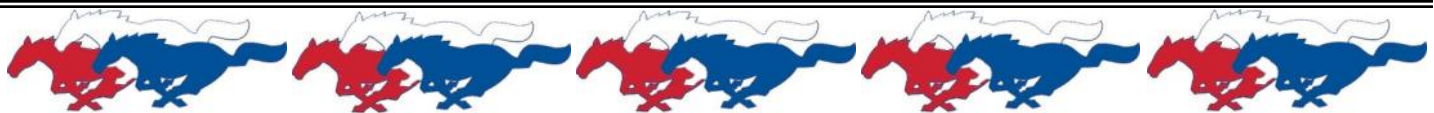

If you have a special place or unique experience you want to share, set up a cruise or event. If you create it they will come!

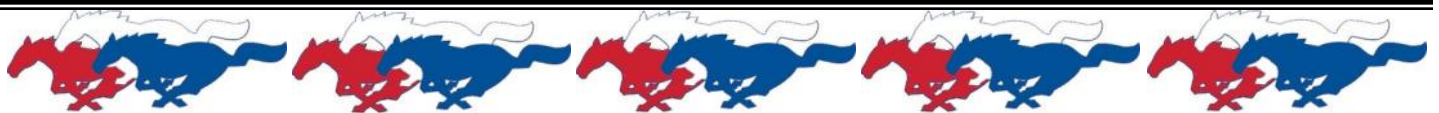


Car of the Month

As they finish their eighth year of being open, I think most of the Mustang community knows about The Cobra Experience in Martinez, CA, a non-profit museum and event center committed to the promotion, conservation, education and preservation of the cars produced by Shelby American. The museum was founded in 2014 and is operated by Drew and Janet Serb and their daughter Emily Lambert, along with a crew of dedicated volunteers. As they like to say, "The cars can't talk, but we can!" Their official tag line is "America's



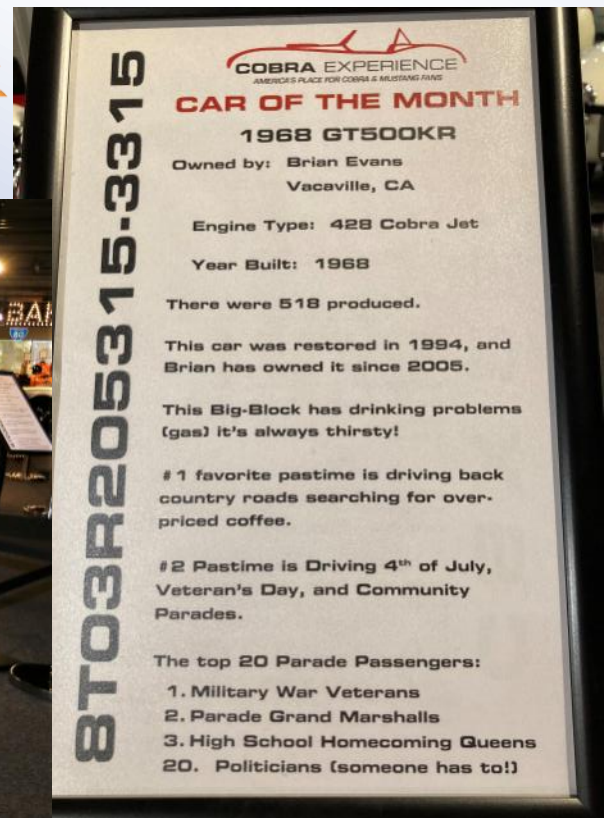

Place for Cobra and Mustang Fans” They are very down to earth and a wonderful family to share the cars and memorabilia with the general public. The museum is open the third Sunday of every month and if you visit their website at www.cobraexperience.org you will see that there are many other events held throughout the year. Now that I’ve earned a beer from Emily for this free plug, on to the car of the month

A new program they have just started is a “Car of the Month” program, where the Museum would like to honor one car each month from their Northern California “fan base”, by displaying the car in the museum for a month. The only requirement is that the car must be a Ford (duh!)...and fit on their car lift to get it into the museum! There are several opportunities or levels of participation: “The Riverside”; “The Sebring”; “The Daytona”; and “The Le Mans”...each one with a different cost (it is a fundraiser for them) and features, benefits, levels of “swag” that are described in detail on their website. At a minimum, you get to keep the placard that is displayed next to every car in the museum describing its features, you get a swag bag, and you receive a picture of you with your car in the museum.

Yours truly enthusiastically signed up to participate, and currently I have the honor of displaying my 1968 Shelby in the museum, from last month’s November 20 Public Open Day to the upcoming December 18th Open Day. Remember, the car doesn’t have to be a Shelby, or even a Mustang, to participate! Just has to be a Ford. Gotta a lime green 1973 Pinto wagon with the (rare) plastic simulated wood paneling on the sides (rare because it hasn’t flaked off yet!)? ...let’s see it in the Musuem!

So if you haven’t seen the Museum, or haven’t visited in a while, come on out on Sunday, December 18th, between the hours of 10am to 3pm. The 18 minute promo movie on Carroll Shelby, the history of Shelby American, and the historical significance of what they accomplished on the 1960’s international auto scene, is alone worth the price of the \$10 admission!

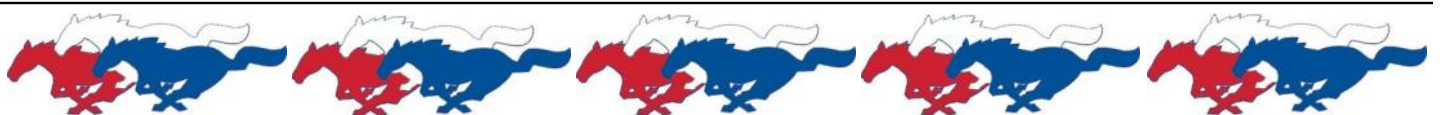

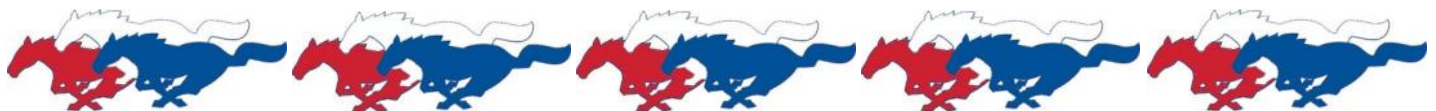
