We left promptly at 2:30 to drive up to the Winters museum. Rather than backtrack from his house, Brian Evans met us there. Besides Brian, the rest of the crew included Dan & Norma McCabe, Sue Calvert, Jerry & Cyndy Lamphiear, Bob Fentress, Melinda & Chris Barkman, Scott & Karen Bradley and Neal & Deborah Randles as well as Frank & I.

We arrived just before our scheduled time of 3:00 p.m., and were cheerfully greeted by several docents, Carol being the assigned docent in charge. Several of them had generations of family lineage as residents of Monticello and the fertile valley, and had stories to tell. In fact, Dan McCabe was surprised to see that one of the docents was "Scooter", a man Dan worked with at Kaiser Steel in Napa. Scooter had a story of his own and he noted that in the picture of the river baptism it was his grandmother that was being baptized. *Editors note: the picture was taken around 1899.*

What stories and what a history! Can you imagine farming families living there for generations, and having their lives suddenly upended and being forced to leave? All the details were very interesting. We enjoyed talking with the docents, and perusing the artifacts and photos of the people, the valley, and the building of the dam. In fact, Carol told us that the building the Museum is in was used as the office for the project, and as such is known as the "dam(n) building."

The Museum provided complimentary cookies and small bottles of water. I hope some members took advantage of that perk. It was told the cookies were made by a very good cook. After thanking the informative docents we left to head west on 128 to the Berryessa Brewery.

At the Brewery we snagged a couple of tables in the shade, and some of us tasted beers and some of us also bought food off the Buckhorn Food Truck. A raffle prize was provided by Pat & Frank and without peeking, Brian Evans drew the name of the winner! It was the McCabes and the prize was a set of Berryessa beer glasses. Dan commented that when he saw beer glasses in the tasting room, he was thinking of buying a glass or two; now he didn't need too!

After the food was eaten and the beers guzzled, our Berryessa host, Lori Nicolini Miller, conducted a very informative tour of the entire brewing process. She was delightful and absolutely did a great job of explaining the process. It was a pretty warm afternoon, so the "cooling" room (39 degrees) seemed to be a favorite spot. This is no ordinary brewery. The commitment to quality and the care that goes into the brewing is quite evident. One example is, although it's more expensive, they purchase their hops only from the best, which is in Yakima Washington. The Millers founded this brewery and moved to Winters from their home in Washington, and brought with them a lot of topnotch experience. Tour and Dan and Norma made that one of the tour stops! Dan made sure to show Lori pictures from our visit.)

We all left with some knowledge and appreciation of the Brewery process and respect for the Millers for their work ethic and devotion to the finest beer possible. We wish all the rest of our club could have joined us, the day was a blast!


