

Tech Talk 2.0 By Paul Troxell

Spa Day

I thought today that since we have all been out enjoying the good weather and driving our cars that I would share a few tips on how to keep your car looking good. This will not apply so much to those who have show cars that don't see much road time, but more to the daily driver. When I detail my car, it is a 5–6-hour affair. A complete inside and out job. Under the hood and in the trunk. Here is how I get started.

Use good quality products (Oh Ya!! You did not think that I was going to just wash the car. Did You?). I prefer Meguiar's, but there are a huge number of well known (and not so well known) products to choose from with pricing ranging from quite reasonable to really pretty darn expensive. A good place to start for selection is any well-known auto parts store, Walmart, or the InterWeb. Yes, the old cliché "You get what you pay for!" applies here. And you can see that it is not difficult to bust our Benjamin's if you want the best products. Use what fits your goal and budget. It is kind of like whiskey. Some of us can get by with Old Red Eye and others drink the \$300 bottle stuff as the "usual".

On a cool car (I am talking temperature of the car's surface so I am the guy washing my car at 6:30am) I use the two-bucket wash method. Two clean buckets with soap in each. Use a wash mitt designed for the job. Wet the car down and start on the roof working your way down. Do small sections at a time so that the soap does not dry. Letting that happen will only make more work later. After washing a roof, the mitt goes into bucket A, rinse the car, and then rinse the mitt in bucket A to get the grit it may have picked up and then go to bucket B and rinse again to make sure that there are no abrasives in it. Then wash the next section. After each section you follow the EXACT same rinse procedure and bucket sequence to keep your wash mitt clean. This helps to greatly reduce scratching of the paint and hours of polishing to correct. You will thank me later.

Once you have washed the entire car use your leaf blower to dry it off. I know, it's only 7:15am and it might wake the neighbors. Did they think about you when they were drinking and carousing in the hot tub last night until 2am? Blow all of the excess water off and then use a large micro fiber to get any excess along with the trunk, hood, and door jams. I finish drying the wheels last. I almost forgot, there are some very cool brushes for wheel cleaning and products that remove brake dust. Read the directions on these very carefully to ensure that they are safe to use on your wheels. Improper use can stain or damage the finish if directions are not followed.

Now let's get started on the interior. Vacuum any heavy dust and debris from the doors, dash, and that miserable spot behind the rear seats. Gawd! I hate doing the contortions required to get into the back of these cars. May be why I still have a soft spot for my '82 Fox Body. Didn't think so much about it back then, but the hatchback eliminated the rear window cleaning problem of the fastback. Now use the interior cleaner (if needed) on all of the surfaces inside the car. You can go straight on with the protectant if everything is clean. I wet a microfiber, wring it out, and apply the protectant. This helps to apply the product evenly and easily. Do not use protectant on leather if your car has leather upholstery. There is a separate product for it that conditions and nourishes the leather helping to keep it soft and pliable while also bringing a nice luster after it is polished off. Next, I clean all interior glass. My go to here is Spray Away Glass Cleaner. It is ammonia free and does not streak when applied with CLEAN microfiber. By the way, never use fabric softeners or dryer sheets when you are washing your microfibers. That is unless you like to spend hours cussing and trying to get the streaks and smears off the glass and out of your fresh clean, polish, and wax job on the paint. And finally, vacuum the carpets. This will leave the interior looking clean, protected from UV rays and smelling fresh. It also helps protect the interior from those commute stains if it is your

I use a detail spray on the entire exterior to finish off. This gets the water stains and also applies a bit of protection depending on which one you use. Now, clean the exterior glass. Next apply whatever tire protectant that you like best. I prefer to use Aerospace 303 as I am not a fan of that super high gloss look that others prefer. Finally, apply the wheel protectant to finish them off.

This is just for a Saturday morning clean up to get ready to go for an afternoon drive. I am sure many of you already have your favorite products. If not, do some noodling on the InterWeb and bone up on what is available and decide how far you want to go. Talk to those you know who always seem to have their car looking sharp and see what they use. I did not even get into a cut, buff, and wax. That is an entirely different monster perhaps I will expound on that in another Tech Talk. This will get you started and as
