2022 Fairfield Veterans Day Parade

On Saturday November 11, the City of Fairfield, through the Parks and Recreation Department, held its annual Veterans Day Parade. One great thing about living in close proximity to Travis Air Force Base is the way Fairfield and the surrounding cities in Solano County show respect, support and admiration to our entire military community and especially our Veterans. This annual parade is just one way that this is accomplished. While Fairfield is known for its 10am ceremony and lunch-time parade, Vacaville, Dixon and Suisun also hold Veterans Day events and ceremonies. This year's parade theme was "SALUTING AMERICA'S VETERANS"

I feel the parade themes over these last several years have been very meaningful and appropriate. Prior parade themes have been: 2022: "SERVING WITH HONOR"; "FRONT PATRIOTS"; 2021: LINE2019: "CELEBRATING 100 YEARS OF AMERICAN LEGION" 2018: "CELEBRATING TRAVIS AIR FORCE BASE 75TH ANNIVERSARY"; 2017: "WITH RESPECT, HONOR and GRATITUDE"; 2016: "PRAY. THANK. REMEMBER" and from 2015: "LAND OF THE FREE, BECAUSE OF THE BRAVE". I particularly like this last one. But they are all good stuff to pause and reflect on... Please go back and read them again.

While I personally never served in the armed forces, my late dad was a transport pilot for the Air Force for 21 years, flying the C-124 (Ol' Shakey!) for ten years, the brand new (at the time!) C-141 for six years, and finally the brand new (again, at the time) C-5 for his last three years 1970 - 1972. He also spent six months flying the F-100 Super Sabre at Cannon AFB New Mexico, in preparation for his tour in Vietnam in 1967-68, and then retired

from Travis as a Lt. Col. when I was just a little guy. And now my son Taylor is a fourth year Air Force pilot flying the B-52 at Barksdale AFB in Louisiana, following in his grandfather's footsteps. So the personal connection to the Air Force is strong, and I'm pleased that our club, through the efforts of Bill Davis and many others, does so much for our Veterans, both locally and at the Veterans Home in Yountville.

We started the day at our usual Solano Mall/Starbucks parking lot meeting place at the requested arrival time of 10:15am and had plenty of time to visit with each other and blow our last paycheck in Starbucks! And what would a Veterans Day Parade be without seeing Terry Burke looking sharp in his Air Force dress blues?

For as many years as I can remember, The Golden Hills Mustang Club made a strong presence at this parade, this year with 13 Mustangs! Although 13 is a little short of the 20 plus cars we've had at some recent parades, we still had as many, if not more, cars than other car clubs (ahem, and better looking too!).

Once again, the parade organizer asked me to provide my '68 convertible to carry the Grand Marshal in the parade; this year it was Frederick B. Young, Jr, who retired at Travis after a 20-year career of service to his country. Mr. Young was very pleased, and humbled, with this honor. (And a special thanks to Dan McCabe who agreed to be my backup convertible with his 2008 Shelby GT, as my '68 wasn't released from the "brake hospital" until literally the night before!)

With our cars decorated in our usual patriotic theme, we waited for the low altitude flyover of the new Air Force KC 46 Pegasus which signals for the parade to begin, and soon it was time to take our turn parading down Texas Street. Just like last year, when we reached the judging stand, the parade emcee encouraged us to "rev 'em up a little...let's hear those ponies roar!"

After the parade, most of us enjoyed a nice lunch at Suisun's Los Altos Mexican restaurant, where we all participated in our own "Battle of the Bulge" with their neverending chips and salsa and tasty Mexican food! This year, we invited the directors of the Gavin Buchanon Foundation to join us for lunch, where VP Dan & Norma McCabe and President Sue Calvert presented them with their check from the proceeds of our annual car show.

Once again, I'd like to thank the club for making a great showing at this parade, supporting our Veterans and our community. And finally, to the many in our club who have served our country, THANK YOU for your service!
