
National Mustang Day

It had been several years since GHMC had participated in this show, so it was great to recommence the clubs attendance at this popular event which draws 400+ pre-1990 American made classics, and approximately 5,000 spectators!



GHMC was represented by Rob Lo in his 1967 Brittany Blue Coupe, Jim & Ian Isaacson in a 1967 Candyapple Red Coupe, William Vallejos in his Springtime Yellow 1966 coupe, and Joel Edelmann in his 1966 Candyapple Red Convertible. Dan and Cristy Cordiero were also participating with Boyz Under the Hood in their beautiful 1932 Ford Roadster. All of us were able to secure prime locations near the waterfront on the First Street Green located at the corner of 1st Street and East B Street in beautiful downtown Benicia. All registered participants were treated to a tasty pancake breakfast after parking and prior to official opening of the show.



This is a weeklong event that has Show 'n Shines all over town including at the local High Schools. A drive-in movie night, a wonderful cruise on Friday, and the huge show on Saturday all make for a very fun time. Most of us drive up on Thursday and return on Sunday. This year, Tammy Robinette had made all the hotel reservations for both clubs and when we got there they had coned-off all of our parking spots, so that we were able to save our spots for the entire weekend. Also, we had a nice welcome gift in our rooms. Thank You, Tammy, for making all the arrangements and we are sorry that you were not able to make it.

We spend Thursday getting there, then getting checked in for the show. Our packets that we picked up included the windshield sticker that lets you into the Friday night cruise and the big show, along with a nice KAN coffee cup and two wristbands that allow you into the concert and car show.

Friday morning we had to decide what event to go to, knowing that we needed to be back in time for our annual early dinner at Logan's Road House. This year, some went to the High School while others went to the San Francisco Deli

Tech Talk 2.0

Just to wrap up last month's ramblings on tire pressure, let's get an idea of what to check your tire pressures with. You will need a tire pressure gauge. Of course, it is as easy as doing a fast search on the InterWeb by typing in "Best Tire Pressure Gauge". Now one could spend a lot of time reading every listed site, but you will find that generally they just repeat the same information. I prefer digital gauges, even though they require a new battery every few years, because they are easy to read. The most important thing about checking your tire pressures is **DOING IT!** Since I have an air compressor in my garage, I can check the tires and add air if needed. If you are not so equipped, a stop at just about any reputable tire shop can get the deed done for free! However, remember that you have been driving on them and the tires are now heated up. When tire temperature goes up, so does pressure. So best accuracy will be had when checked cold. If your tires were properly inflated during the cooler months, they will be over inflated now that the weather has warmed up. I recommend checking them weekly, and cold if you can. If you can't make the tire shop your first stop on Saturday morning, before you do the rest of the running around. And, just to remind you, the several square inches of tire that contacts the roadway are where it all happens. Acceleration, braking, cornering, all happen on those four (less is you drive at the limit) little contact patches. Take care of your tires and they will take care of you.

Now, how about another thing that most often gets neglected? When was the last time that you had the fluid in the brake system flushed? Did you know that even if the car does not get driven that the fluid's performance decays? Yes, brake fluid is "hygroscopic". That means that the brake fluid has the ability to attract, absorb, and hold water from the surrounding environment. Brake fluid is designed with a high boiling point (depending on the fluid 400-600+ degrees), and this allows it to perform in the brake system without boiling. When the fluid boils in a brake system, bubbles develop, and the braking efficiency declines rapidly causing the pedal to feel spongy or go all the way to the floor creating a very dangerous situation. As the brake fluid ages it picks up moisture from the surrounding environment, more so during the winter months and in high humidity conditions. **AND**, since water boils at 212 degrees it lowers the boiling point of the brake fluid. This lowers the amount of braking that can be applied and causes the system to develop the spongy pedal or no pedal condition. Water and contaminants in the system will also cause corrosion and sludge to build up.

Remember, modern braking systems are very sophisticated compared to the drum brake systems that were used back in the day. Modern braking systems often include anti-lock, traction, and stability control systems within them. To maintain their performance, they require regular servicing just like the oil in our engines, the fluid in the transmission, and the coolant in the radiator. Even if you only bring your classic car out when the weather is the nicest, you should change the brake fluid on a regular schedule. There are test kits for testing brake fluid for moisture and contamination, and they can be found on the InterWeb. If you are not a certified "Shadetree Mechanic" see your service technician and ask them to test, and if needed, flush your brake system. Use the brake fluid that meets or exceeds the specification by the car manufacturer (it is in the Owner's Manual). If you are adding fluid regularly have your system inspected **IMMEDIATELY**. This could indicate a leak and could be a very dangerous situation. Just to give you an idea of how important the brake fluid is, nearly all who put their cars on the racetrack flush the brake system with fresh fluid each time they track the car. That would be excessive for a car only driven on the roads and highways, but a must if you want to be able to confidently slowdown from say 130MPH to 40-50 MPH in order to make a turn on the track and do it over and over for the length of the session or race.

You will be rewarded with brakes that work more efficiently, have higher protection from boiling (on those high-speed mountain runs), and increase system component life. However, the most important benefit of all is that you will be able to stop safely each and every time, protecting the lives of the ones you love along with your own. Not to mention the car that you have invested so much time and money in. We all like to go fast, let's just make sure that we can always stop safely so that we can go fast again!




