

A Dissertation on The Oil Filter

small part. So small that some do not even know of its existence. It appears only as an item on one of the lines on the invoice that we get from whomever we allow to do the lowly task of changing the oil. But! To those of us who know, it is an item that we have spent hours watching YouTube videos about. And, more hours searching the Interweb for that miraculous one that converts mere engine oil into that heavenly elixir that adds 40+ will find more on the lowly filter: horsepower by its use.

that screws onto our engines is a pretty important part of the engines that give our ponies legs. Its primary purpose is to filter out contamination that can damage the moving parts of the engine. Our cars have what is called a full flow filtration system. Most Engineering degree, let me offer these guidelines for oil filter cars built prior to about the 1950's did not have oil filtration systems on them. And when they were first started to be used, they were only actually offered as an option. Even then they were only a by-pass system which filtered a small percentage of the oil and then returned it back to the sump. This was an improvement reducing sludge build up and extended the time between oil drains by a small amount.

engine oil life and engine cleanliness began the voyage into the modern oils and filters we have today. The oils of yesterday can make no comparison to modern oils in terms of lubricating ability, service life, purity, and performance. But, in order to fulfill its mission, it still requires the lowly oil filter. And here is a bit on the market. Some are as good as the Motorcraft, and there are on our subject of the month.

The oil filter was invented in 1923 by Earnest John Sweetman and George H. Greenhalgh in 1922 and in 1923 they started the company Motor Improvements, Inc. Their filter was standard equipment on 1920's Chrysler automobiles with the Chrysler Six engine. Later, the company changed its name to Purolator Products, Inc. Purolator being a play on "Pure Oil Later". As goes many companies, Purolator has been sold and purchased several times over the past 100 years and is owned by Mann+Hummell in Germany today.

can vary from incredibly good to ashamedly disgusting. It has what seems a simple job, but reality is that its job requires highquality materials and somewhat expensive machinery to produce. There are several materials that are used to filter the oil. Paper, fiberglass, cellulose, and synthetic. Of course, steel makes up the filter canister and many of the internal parts. They can have pretty paint jobs on the outside and do a terrible job of filtering, and the opposite can be true. So, let's just look at what they are sup- Until next time, change your oil and filter at a regular intervals, posed to do.

Most engine manufacturers have agreed that particles in engine oil larger than 20 microns (20 millionths of a meter) are detrimental to engine internals and need to be minimized. So, most oil filter manufacturers will tout their product as being able to filter particles of 20 microns. That sounds great, but means absolutely nothing. This is what is referred to as a nominal rating.

What is far more important is what percentage of the particles The oil filter, as it relates to our beloved Mustangs, is but a that are 20 microns will the filter catch? This is called a Beta Rating and gives information on the filter's efficiency. There are other qualities that are just as important and some that are more important for oil filters to accomplish their task. For a good explanation of Beta Rating see:

For those of you who aren't interested in getting your MLS selection. If you are taking your car to a fast lube place, you are probably not getting a top tier oil filter installed. They make their filter selection based mostly on price, not quality. There are other considerations, but price usually makes the decision. But, keep heart, at least you are having your oil changed and that is a good thing. Motorcraft filters are the factory brand for Ford Motor Company automobiles. They are easily identifiable because Mo-With the advent of the full flow oil filter system in the 50's, torcraft will be prominently on the outside of the filter. If your dealer is not using them, ask why.

> If you are a DIY'er, you can be assured that the Motorcraft filter is the proper filter for your application and meets ALL of Ford's specifications. There are several other very reliable brands even a very few that might be better. Don't allow the marketers to make your decision, if you are really picky about these things, do the research on the filter you are considering. Even contact the manufacturer if you cannot find the beta rating and other important particulars. Ford Racing Performance is another option for those who are looking for better performance (or they would not call it Performance, right?). It is the one that I choose. Like I always say "Oil (and filters) are cheap compared to engine rebuild or replacement!"

Well folks, sorry to expose you to this thumbnail on the sub-Oil filters are marketed and sold worldwide and their quality ject of filtration. It is a subject that could go on for several pages with detail that some of you might find of interest. And most would find, perhaps, a waste of time. Suffice it to say that the subject of lubrication and filtration is an area where some go as far as getting degrees studying it. 
