# With President Bob Fentress





If you have heard a 5.2 liter GT350 rev up against a GT Mustang you know the sound is very different as well. The simplified exhaust is why the car is louder and has a different tone. Since you have a cylinder on both the left and right engine banks firing simultaneously, you have an exhaust note from each pipe simultaneously.
